POSITION: PHYSICIAN

Temporary, relief/on-call, hourly intermittent position(s) available on an ongoing basis in the Student Health Center. CSUS is establishing a list of Physicians who would be available on short notice for temporary hourly intermittent employment to meet coverage needs of the Student Health Center.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES: Under the supervision of the Director, Health Services this position provides direct primary and preventative health care and education to students. Duties include, but are not limited to:

- Assess diagnosis and treat acute episodic and sub-acute illnesses and injuries including athletic medicine.
- Perform routine physical examinations for athletics, travel, employment (including DMV physicals), annual gynecologic exams, or other examinations.
- Assess diagnosis and treat reproductive health needs in both men and women including STD's, contraceptive counseling and pregnancy counseling.
- Order and interpret x-rays and laboratory tests and treat appropriately. Write prescriptions. Make referrals to specialty care as indicated.
- Maintain proper medical records and utilize the SOAP (Subjective-Objective-Assessment-Plan) format in charting medical notes.
- Work collaboratively with all Health Center staff members in a team approach.
- Advise and counsel students on health education, preventive medical care and health promotion. Provide counseling in psychosocial issues and make referrals as necessary. Participate in campus wellness activities. Assist with various vaccination programs.
- Write health related articles for campus newsletters and student newspapers as time permits.
- Serve as physician consultant resource or preceptor to Nurse Practitioners. Provide professional medical consultation to other Health Center personnel.
- Provide consultative services on health related issues to other campus departments and programs.
- Establish and maintain cooperative and sensitive working relationships with a diverse, multicultural student population and university community.
- Serves as the Chair of the Continuous Quality Improvement Program and as the Chief Risk Management Officer; designs, develops, implements CQI studies; tracks evidenced based trends, maintains, updates CQI, QA and Risk Management Records for Accreditation Standards. Provides peer review for the CQI Process.
- Participates in refining Emergency Preparedness, Response and Recovery Protocols, staff development and training.
- Collaborates in policy and procedure development and makes revisions as needed.
- Attends professional, clinical and staff conferences (including case conferences or other medical presentations).
- Remains current with the Evidenced Based Practice of Medicine and Continuing Medical Education (CME) requirements, professional educational opportunities (via teleconferences, webinars and on-line presentations).
- Serve on other campus committees as assigned including campus health and safety programs.
- Act as a medical liaison with other community health agencies and services.
- Consult with private physicians and public health agencies in securing treatment for students requiring services beyond that available on campus.
- Perform other duties or projects as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- M.D. or D.O. degree from a medical school recognized by the Medical Board of California. Board diplomate in Family practice, internal medicine or other appropriate primary care specialty. Completion of annual continuing education required.
- Completion of one or more residency programs in a specialty appropriate to the assigned duties with increasingly responsible experience in the practice of that specialty. Two years or its equivalent of increasingly responsible experience in their practice specialty. Prior or current affiliation with a hospital or outpatient clinic is preferred.
- Incumbents must possess and maintain the legal requirements for the practice of medicine in the State of California including the following:
 - Possess and maintain a valid and relevant State of California license to practice medicine
 - Possess and maintain current American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) or American Osteopathic Association (AOA) medical board of certification appropriate for the assigned duties.
 - Possess and maintain a valid Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) certificate and number for prescribing controlled substances.
 - Current cardiopulmonary resuscitation and automated external defibrillator (CPR/AED) certification as appropriate for the assigned duties.

SPECIALIZED SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

- Previous experience working in college health desirable. Women's healthcare and sports medicine experience desirable. Prior or current affiliation with a hospital or outpatient clinic is desirable. Ability to perform minor office surgery, preferred.
- Thorough knowledge of and the ability to effectively apply the principles and methods essential to the assigned medical specialty.
- Thorough knowledge in the diagnosis and treatment of common medical disorders and in the assessment and response to emergency situations.
- Thorough knowledge of community resources in medical treatment and public health practices. Thorough knowledge of local, state, and national laws and regulations pertaining to the medical field and specialty. Thorough knowledge of applicable professional ethics and standards.
- Ability to serve as a mentor and resource consultant for other health center personnel.
- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with a variety of medical practitioners and specialists, as well as students, administrators, and faculty
- The successful candidate must be fingerprinted and successfully pass a background check, which may include checks of employment records, criminal records, civil records, and motor vehicle records.
