



VICE PRESIDENT FOR UNIVERSITY ADVANCEMENT

CSU Stanislaus invites nominations and applications for the position of Vice President for University Advancement.

CSU Stanislaus is part of the California State University, a 23-campus system across California. With more than 400,000 students, CSU is the largest, the most diverse, and one of the most affordable university systems in the country. CSU campuses emphasize access to quality public higher education and workforce preparation that is responsive to regional needs.

Founded in 1957 as Stanislaus State College, it was awarded university status and renamed California State University, Stanislaus in 1985. The 228-acre main campus is located in Turlock, in the heart of California's Central Valley, a short distance from the San Francisco Bay Area, Monterey, Big Sur, the Sierra Nevada mountains, and the state governmental hub of Sacramento. The main campus in Turlock is complemented by the 108-acre Stockton Development Center, and the Merced Tri-College Center on the Merced College Campus providing additional educational access to residents in the San Joaquin Valley.

Princeton Review has ranked CSU Stanislaus in its top 373 colleges and universities for the past six years. At CSU Stanislaus, the diverse student body reflects CSU Stanislaus's focus on providing the highest quality education to the diverse population of California, including many first generation college students and working parents. The student body of 8,305 includes 6,972 undergraduate students and 1,333 graduate students (fall 2010). CSU Stanislaus is noted as a Hispanic-serving university by *US News and World Report*, and is listed as a Hispanic serving institution by the U.S. Department of Education. Organized in six colleges, the University offers over 100 majors, minors, concentrations and teaching credentials, 24 master's degree programs and six graduate certificate programs as well as an Executive MBA and a doctoral degree program in Educational Leadership. The highly accessible faculty is known for teaching, research, and service. More than half of the faculty are full-time and tenured or on the tenure track. Over 80 percent of the 285 full-time faculty hold doctorates or terminal degrees in their fields. The full-time faculty is augmented by 178 part-time faculty. CSU Stanislaus fields 14 men's and women's athletics teams in the California Collegiate Athletic Association and is affiliated nationally with the National Collegiate Athletics Association (NCAA), Division II.

Blending traditional liberal arts offerings with the professions, CSU Stanislaus is an exceptional public university that, because of its student-friendly size and commitment to excellence, is able to offer all the benefits of a private education. CSU Stanislaus is committed to creating a learning environment which encourages all members of the campus community to expand their intellectual, creative, and social horizons. The University is proud of its service to the region and its community partnerships which foster mutual growth and success. Under the five-year strategic plan launched in 2007, CSU Stanislaus is committed to making its aspiration to be a place where academic excellence underscores teaching excellence a reality. Threaded through these strategic actions is attention to growing the institution's reputation and image.

CSU Stanislaus has built a solid foundation through planned growth, determined adherence to principles of collegial academic exploration, commitment to service to the region, and above all, to the idea that close collaboration between and among faculty and students creates engaged and responsive learning communities.

CSU Stanislaus seeks a senior level development officer with proven success in the areas of development, alumni relations, public and legislative affairs, corporate and foundation relations, communications and special events. The Vice President for University Advancement leads the planning, organization and implementation of programs to secure ongoing financial resources for the University, including donor development, major gifts, corporate and foundation relations, alumni relations, planned giving, university communications, public and legislative affairs, donor relations and special events. The Vice President plans and implements both short- and long-term goals and objectives to strengthen and expand the University's fund raising and external relations efforts. The Vice President serves on the Board of Directors of the University's foundation and provides staff support to its Development Committee. The Vice President for University Advancement reports directly to the President and serves as a member of the President's Cabinet.

The Search Committee will accept confidential applications and nominations until the position is filled. Candidate screening will begin immediately. For best consideration, applications and nominations should be provided by November 18, 2011. An application should include a letter describing relevant experiences and interest in the position, a resume, and the names of at least five references with titles, addresses, business telephone numbers and e-mail addresses.
