The Master of Science in Nursing degree requires completion of 36 units distributed as follows:

1. Fifteen units of core courses,
2. Eighteen units of graduate coursework in a concentration or specialization including 3 to 6 units of elective course work at the undergraduate 4000 level or graduate level,
3. Students in all concentrations may choose between Project, Comprehensive Examination, or Thesis. This choice should be made early in the program. Students will consult with the graduate adviser for current policies.
4. Students completing a culminating experience option must participate in an oral presentation to complete the program.

The **BRIDGE Program** allows an Associate Degree Nurse (ADN) with a Registered Nurse (RN) license and a non-nursing Bachelor's degree to be admitted to the Masters of Science in Nursing program while taking bridge courses. These students are admitted under a provisional status that require the completion of the bridge course work prior to being fully admitted to the masters program. The current bridge courses include:

1. NURS 3000 Advanced Health Assessment,
2. NURS 4400 Community Health,
3. NURS 4410 Community Health Clinical, and
4. NURS 3310 Leadership and Management.

Availability of the bridging courses corresponds with the current ADN-BSN course roadmap and would not require additional courses.

Progression

The CSU, Stanislaus Masters of Science in Nursing can be taken only on a part-time basis. Students in the graduate nursing program must maintain a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 in courses taken to satisfy the requirements of the degree. Students who fail to maintain a 3.0 GPA will be placed on academic probation.
