- POSITION:** **ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF PHILOSOPHY:** The Philosophy program at CSU Stanislaus invites applications for a tenure-track position in Philosophy. AOS: Philosophy and Gender; Feminism; Philosophy of Race and Ethnicity; or Philosophy of Labor. AOC: Continental Philosophy; Ethics. Course preparations are likely to include some combination of the following lower division courses: Introduction to Philosophy, Critical Thinking, Contemporary Moral Issues, and Introduction to Political Philosophy. Upper division courses relevant to this position would include Concepts of Race and Identity, Ethics, Introduction to Continental Philosophy, Bioethics, and Philosophy and Feminism.
- MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:** Ph.D. in Philosophy (with formal training in Continental Philosophy). University-level teaching experience.
- PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:** Evidence of successful teaching in Philosophy, especially courses related to those listed above. Active research agenda and scholarly publications germane to the position.
- HOW TO APPLY & DEADLINE:** A complete application must include: (1) current CV; (2) teaching statement; (3) sample syllabi for courses of interest; (4) recent teaching evaluations; (5) three references including contact information; (6) research statement, (7) research sample, and (8) copies of graduate transcripts. Screening of applications will commence December 21, 2019 with initial interviews projected for early February 2019.

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT and THE COLLEGE: The Department of Philosophy and Modern Languages houses the Philosophy, Spanish, and Portuguese programs. The Philosophy program emphasizes the history of philosophy, along with recent trends in post-structural and post-modern thought. Emphasis is on primary source material, the cultivation of strong analytic and interpretive skills, and the construction of defensible and interesting arguments. The Philosophy major consists of two tracks, one for general studies compatible with other second majors, the other designed to prepare students for graduate study in the field. The program also serves the General Education curriculum with an assortment of courses in critical thinking, ethics, and humanities.

CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CLEARANCE NOTICE

The university requires a criminal and/or child abuse background check to be completed for many of its new employees, current employees seeking promotional or transfer opportunities, and current employees assigned new duties. Satisfactory completion of a background check (including a criminal records check) is required for employment. CSU will make a conditional offer of employment, which may be rescinded if the background check reveals disqualifying information, and/or it is discovered that the candidate knowingly withheld or falsified information. Failure to satisfactorily complete the background check may affect the continued employment of a current CSU employee who was conditionally offered the position. Failure to consent to any background check will disqualify an applicant from further consideration. Additionally, an applicant who fails to provide the necessary information or who provides false or misleading information may also be disqualified from further consideration. Later discovery of false or misleading information related to the background check may result in the offer of employment being withdrawn or subject the employee to disciplinary action, up to and including termination.
