

Campus Data Portfolio Commonly Used Terms and Notes

Census date: Close of the fourth week of instruction.

Bachelor: All undergraduate students, e.g. freshmen, sophomore, junior, and senior level, and postbaccalaureate students seeking a second bachelor's degree as of census date (excluding postbaccs concurrently enrolled in a Credential program. This is consistent with IPEDS definition of undergraduate students.

Note: Headcount enrollments for the following groups of students, i.e., Credential, Postbaccalaureate, and Graduate, are reported in the aggregate as Graduate level students for IPEDS reporting purposes, but disaggregated for internal reporting purposes. Students admitted and enrolled in multiple programs as of the fall census date are counted only once in the primary program.

Credential: Postbaccalaureate students admitted and enrolled in CSU CCTC-Approved credential or subject matter waiver programs as of census date (excluding students concurrently enrolled in a Master's or Doctorate degree program).

Postbaccalaureate: Students who hold a baccalaureate or equivalent degree who have not been officially admitted to a Master's or Doctorate degree program, credential program, and/or undergraduate degree program as of census date.

Graduate: Students who hold a baccalaureate or equivalent degree who have been officially admitted to a Master's or Doctorate degree program as of census date. Students who are concurrently enrolled in a credential program are only included in the Graduate category.

Primary Service Region: Calaveras, Mariposa, Merced, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, and Tuolumne Counties.

College Year: Summer, fall, winter, and spring terms.

Academic Year: Fall, winter, and spring terms.

Official Off-Campus Center: The Stockton campus is the only official off-campus center. Stockton enrollments headcounts and FTES include students who are enrolled in one or more courses at the Stockton campus as of census date.

Full-Time Bachelor students: Students attempting 12 or more semester units as of fall census date.

Part-Time Bachelor students: Students attempting fewer than 12 semester units as of fall census date.

Full-Time Credential/Postbaccalaureate/Graduate students: Students attempting 9 or more semester units as of fall census date.

Part-Time Credential/Postbaccalaureate/Graduate students: Students attempting fewer than 9 semester units as of fall census date.

Freshman: Students with fewer than 30 accumulated semester credit hours as of census date.

Sophomore: 30 to fewer than 60 accumulated semester credit hours as of census date.

Junior: 60 to fewer than 90 accumulated semester credit hours as of census date.

Senior: 90 or more accumulated semester credit hours as of census date.

College data: Data reported by college are disaggregated based on the current six-college structure.

Interdisciplinary degree programs: Special Major (BA/BS) and Interdisciplinary Studies (MA/MS) are interdisciplinary degree programs and therefore are not assigned a college. However, enrollments and degrees conferred in these programs are reported with the College of Humanities & Social Sciences in this publication.

Discontinued degree program: The Bachelor of Vocational Education (BVE) was discontinued effective fall 2003.

Suspended degree program: The Bachelor of Arts in French (BA) was suspended effective fall 2006. The Bachelor of Science in Computer Information Systems was suspended effective fall 2010.

Degree program name changes: The Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Studies: Elementary Teaching Content Preparation was formerly the Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Studies. The Bachelor of Science in Applied Leadership was formerly the Bachelor of Science in Applied Studies. The Bachelor of Arts in Kinesiology was formerly the Bachelor of Arts in Physical Education.
