TEACH Grant Teaching Requirements

To Fulfill your teaching obligation, your certification form must indicate that:

- you have taught as a full-time teacher
- 2. in a high-need field and
- 3. at a school serving low-income families and students.
- The high-need field must be listed on the certification form or must have been listed on the federal or state high-need fields list at any time that you received a TEACH Grant.
- The school must be a qualifying school at the time you being teaching. If the school or educational service agency where you teach is listed in the TCLI Directory for all or a part of one of your required four school years of teaching, but it no longer qualifies to be listed in the TCLI Directory for your subsequent years of teaching at that school, your subsequent years of teaching at that school or will still fulfill your service obligation.



TEACH Grant Exit Counselling

The TEACH Grant exit counseling will provide you with important information regarding

- Initially and annually certifying
- Requesting a suspension or discharge of your obligation
- Identifying low-income schools and high need fields
- Circumstances under which a TEACH Grants will convert to a loan

Service Obligation

- Each service obligation begins only after you complete the program for which you received the TEACH Grant
- Unless you have received a temporary suspension of the eightyear obligation period, or your TEACH Grant obligation has been discharged, you must keep the TEACH Grant Servicer informed of your progress toward satisfying your service obligation by certifying your employment each year by your due date

New Policy - Standardized Annual Deadline

A standardized annual certification date has been adopted to simplify the annual certification process for recipients.

- In early October each year, FedLoan Servicing Center will notify all TEACH Grant recipients subject to the annual certification requirement and tell them how to submit their documentation of progress towards completing their TEACH Grant service obligation.

After School - Annual Certification

The TEACH Grant's Agreement to Serve or Repay states that TEACH Grant recipients must submit documentation (TEACH Grant Certification form) each year showing:

- 1. that they have completed a year of qualifying teaching service,
- 2. or they do not have qualifying teaching service but still intend to satisfy their service obligation.
- Starting in 2019, the new annual certification date that will apply to all TEACH Grant recipients is Oct. 31st. Each year at the beginning of October, the TEACH Grant servicer will notify students and tell them how to submit their documentation.
- If recipients do not submit their documentation of progress annually by Oct 31st, and
 do not respond to the reminder notices from FedLoan Serving, all TEACH Grants that
 the recipient received may be converted to Direct Unsubsidized Loans that they must
 then repay with interest.



Annual Certification

- Every year, after you complete each of the four years of required teaching, you must provide The FedLoan Servicing Center with documentation of that teaching service by your due date:
 - The new standard deadline is Oct. 31st each year
- The TEACH Grant Certification form:
 - Is a document that is completed and signed by both you and your employer each year so that you can receive teaching credit.
 - Once the <u>online</u> portion of the certification process is done on the FedLoan website, print out the paper certification form and bring it to your employer to complete and submit back to FedLoan via fax or by uploading to your web account.

The Annual Certification Process - Contact information

- Contact FedLoan Servicing center for help completing the TEACH Grant Certification form at 1-800-699-2908.
- When you are ready to submit your certification form, it is not recommended to submit it through the mail, as this could take up to 2 weeks longer or more for processing.
- It is recommended to scan and upload your completed form to your web account for quicker and secure processing.





Annual Certification Tips

Certification Forms submitted incomplete will not be processed by The FedLoan Servicing Center, and you will be at greater risk of having your grant converted.

- Submit your Certification Form early every October to allow The FedLoan Servicing Center time to notify you of a problem or error on your form.
- Keep record of all contact with The FedLoan Servicing Center, including when and how you've submitted your Certification Forms
- If you have problems or questions on completing the Certification Form, contact The FedLoan Servicing Center directly and early for the most accurate information.



Completing Less than a Full Year

One of the requirements to fulling your service obligation is to be teaching full-time.

If you do not complete a full school year of qualifying teaching service, but complete **at least** one-half of a school year, it can be counted as one of your four required years of teaching **if** your employer considers you to have fulfilled your contract requirements **and** you were unable to complete the school year due to:


- 1. a condition that is a qualifying reason for leave under the Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA); or
- 2. a call or order to active-duty status
- 3. You were residing in or were employed in a federally declared major disaster area.

Multiple Employers

If you taught at more than one qualifying school during a school year, that year of teaching will count as one of your required years of teaching service if:

- you provide The FedLoan Servicing Center with a certification form from the multiple school employment officials involved confirming that the combined teaching is the equivalent of one school year of full-time employment; and
- more than half of the classes that you taught were in high-needs fields.





After School - Suspending your TEACH Grant

You may request a temporary suspension of your service obligation period if you're temporarily unable to teach because you:

- 1. Returned to school and are enrolled in another TEACH grant eligible program.
- 2. A condition that is a qualifying reason for leave under the Family and Medical Leave Act.
- 3. A call or order to active-duty status.
- Are residing in or are employed in a federally declared major disaster area.

Suspensions are granted for one-year increments, not to exceed a combined total of three years.

 TEACH Grants may be also discharged in cases of death, permanent disability or extended military service.

Conversion to a Direct Unsubsidized Loan

A TEACH Grant that a student received will be converted to a loan under any of the following conditions:

- > The student requests that their grants be converted into a loan.
- ➤ The student does not begin or maintain qualifying teaching within a timeframe that would allow them to complete their required four years of teaching within the eight-year service obligation period.
- If grants are converted, the student will be charged interest going back to the date of each TEACH Grant disbursements.




New Policy - Conversion Reconsideration

ED has finalized a process that provides an opportunity for certain TEACH Grant recipients whose TEACH Grants were converted to Direct Unsubsidized Loans to request consideration of the conversions.

Recipients can request reconsideration if (based on documentation provided):

- 1. That the student was satisfying their service obligation
- 2. If the TEACH Grant was converted to a loan in error
- If the student had previously asked for the grant to be converted but student requests it to be converted back to a grant, and only if the student would still have enough time to complete their required four years of teaching within their eight-year service obligation period.



After your TEACH Grant Converts to a Loan

- TEACH Grants converted to a loan, in most cases, cannot be converted back into a grant.
- When a TEACH Grant is converted to a loan, the fixed interest rate will be the rate that was in effect for federal loans on the date of the grant's disbursement.
- At the time the grant converts to a loan, the student will be given the opportunity to pay the interest that accrued from the disbursement date until the conversion date. If the student does not pay this interest, it will be capitalized when the loan enters repayment at the end of the 6-month grace period.
- A converted TEACH Grant will not count toward your aggregate loan limits, but it will be subject to the other terms and conditions that apply to the Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan program.

TEACH Grant Servicer - FedLoan Servicing Center

- TEACH Grant recipients should always contact the FedLoan Servicing Center annually after completing their program to certify their teaching service or determine if they need to request a suspension of their service obligation.
- It's important that recipients keep the FedLoan Servicing Center informed of their current contact information.
- Students can set up a FedLoan account and periodically check their paperless inbox on the FedLoan website for certification notifications and any other updates.
