 - **READING** can be fulfilled by course in critical thinking, literature, philosophy, reading, rhetoric, *or* textual analysis.
 - **MATH** can be fulfilled by a course in algebra, geometry, mathematics, quantitative reasoning, *or* statistics.
 - **WRITING** can be fulfilled by a course in composition, English, rhetoric, written communication, *or* writing.
