When to Apply to the Credential Program

You may apply to the credential program

- ${f a.}$ If you have completed a bachelor's degree (BA or BS) ${f OR}$
- **b.** If you are close to completing your degree (generally, in the last semester of the BA/BS program).

Program Starts

Students may begin the Credential program in the Fall or Spring semesters. Some summer courses are available.

General Requirements

- I. Application and fees
 - a) CSU Stanislaus Graduate Application (\$70 Cal State Apply fee) Submit the Online Application at: www.calstate.edu/apply
 - b) Credential Program 4th Quadrant of Graduate Application (\$30 program fee, separate from above)
- 2. Grade Point Average (GPA) Requirement

The required GPA is 2.75 in the last 60 units or 2.67 overall. Students with a minimum 2.5 GPA in the last 60 units may be considered for "Special Admission" if they have met all Admission Requirements. (Including Basic Skills Requirement and Subject Matter Competency)

Admission Requirements

Applicants may apply before completing the admission requirements, but must have them completed before being accepted into the program.

- Subject Matter Competency www.ctcexams.nesinc.com/ Complete ONE of the following:
 - a) Pass 3 sections of CSET Multiple Subject. (CSET's: 101, 214, and 103) OR
 - b) Pass CSET Single Subject exam or complete a subject matter preparation program (in the areas of Art, English, Foreign Language, Mathematics, Music, Social Science, or Science) OR
 - c) Approved Elementary Subject Matter Program (CSUSTAN LIBS) OR
 - d) Completion of an academic major in the same subject as the credential. Please see SMC form for more information: https://www.csustan.edu/sites/default/files/groups/Credential%20Services/2021/smc_form.pdf
 If using the CSET option: Must submit proof of passage OR

If using the CSET option: Must submit proof of passage OR registration when submitting application. Passage is required prior to the start of the semester for which an application was submitted.

2. <u>Basic Skills Requirement (BSR)</u> Must be met prior to the start of the semester for which an application was submitted.

BSR can be fulfilled in a variety of ways. Please see the BSR Form on our website for details:

3. Early Field Experience

Candidates are required to have a minimum of 45 hours of documented field experience prior to being admitted to the program, **must** be in K-I2 grade US classrooms within the last 5 years.

(Not required for Stanislaus State Liberal Studies majors)

4. English Composition

All CSU graduates will have met this requirement as part of their BA/BS degree.

Can be met by **ONE** of the three options:

- a) Completion of a CSU WP class as part of the undergraduate program (verified by transcripts).
- **b)** Obtain a 41 or better on the writing portion of the CBEST.
- c) Completion of an upper division composition course with a grade of 'C' or better.

5. American Government/Constitution

ALL CSU graduates will have met this requirement as a part of their BA/BS degree.

This requirement can be met by taking a course that covers the U.S. Constitution.

- 6. CCTC Certificate of Clearance AND Livescan.
- 7. Tuberculosis Clearance or TB Risk Assessment Clearance Good for only 4 years.

Frequently Asked Questions about ESCP

What special education credentials are offered at CSU, Stanislaus?

CSU, Stanislaus offers the Preliminary Education Specialist Credentials: Mild/Moderate Support Needs and Extensive Support Needs. The specialty area Mild/Moderate Disabilities (M/M) includes autism; specific learning disabilities; mild to moderate mental retardation; other health impairment; serious emotional disturbance. The specialty area Extensive Support Needs includes autism; deaf-blindness; moderate to severe mental retardation; multiple disabilities; serious emotional disturbance. Both authorize service in grades K–I2 and in classes organized primarily for adults through age 22.

How much does it cost?

Students enrolled in 7 units or more will pay approximately \$4232 per semester (Fall/Spring); students enrolled in 0-6 units will pay approximately \$2834 per semester (Fall/Spring). Financial Aid is available for those who qualify. Contact Financial Aid office for more details at 667-3336.

If I am a student in the Liberal Studies concentration in Exceptional Children and Youth, am I also a candidate in the Special Education Credential Program?

No. Courses in the concentration are required to earn your baccalaureate degree. Declaration of the concentration is not equivalent to admission to the Education Specialist Credential Program.

Must I complete all co-requisite requirements before I apply for admission to the program?

No. You can apply for admission in the same semester you enroll in the co-requisite courses: (a) EDSE 4310 and (b) CDEV 3140 or CDEV 3240. However, you must complete EDSE 4310 with a grade of "B" or better

<u>Can I teach in at the elementary or secondary level with the</u> <u>Preliminary Education Specialist credential?</u>

Yes. The Education Specialist Credential is a K-12 Credential. You are authorized to teach students in the areas authorized on your credential.

I am interested in an internship, but I am not currently employed by a school district or non-public school. Am I eligible to apply for the University's Internship Credential Program?

No. Interns are employed as teachers in collaborating school districts while completing the requirements for the Preliminary Education Specialist Credential. Consult the Program Coordinator for specific procedures and requirements for the University Internship Credential through Stanislaus State.

Am I guaranteed a student teaching placement in the area I reside?

No. While all efforts will be made to place you as close as possible to your residence, the primary criterion in the determination of placement is the quality of experiences the placement will provide.
