January-March	 Enroll in HONS 4960 – Honors Presentation Seminar (1 unit) Continue search for fellowships and scholarships Contact schools about the possibility of visiting and scheduling an interview Generate an alternative plan, consider other options (in case of rejections, attendance deferment, or insufficient funding)
April-May	 Submit research article for publication in the University Honors Program Journal of Exploratory Research Present your project at the University Honors Program Annual Capstone Conference Discuss acceptances, rejections, and other career options with McNair staff Inform all schools and reference writers of your decision Attend the McNair Scholars Graduation Reception Celebrate the end of your journey at Stanislaus State and the beginning of a new one
