LIBS 4910: Cooperative Education Course Outline and Learning Agreement (3-4 Units per term)

<u>Course Description</u>: This course provides an opportunity for Liberal Studies majors to acquire experience as research or instruction assistants in an elementary school setting or community project volunteers, in paid or unpaid positions under the supervision of a Liberal Studies coordinator. This is a project course for involvement of students in instructionally related activities. Options are unlimited and must be approved by the Department Coordinator. Course may be repeated for a total of 8 units. Prerequisite: sophomore standing and consent of the instructor. Class will meet only ONCE to return paperwork, clarify criteria, answer questions and review the written assignment on Wednesday, **September 4**, 2013 from 9-10 am. in DBH-342.

<u>Course objectives</u>: Upon consultation with Christy Gonzales each student will determine personal learning goals for the supervised activity no later than the third week of the term (**September 11, 2013**). Goals are detailed on the Learning Agreement and must relate to pre-professional elementary teaching and at least one of The California Teaching Performance Expectations (TPEs). The TPEs describe the set of knowledge, skills, and abilities beginning teachers should have and be able to demonstrate. Teaching Performance Expectations describe teaching tasks in six broad domains:

- Making Subject Matter Comprehensible to Students
- Assessing Student Learning
- Engaging and Supporting Students in Learning
- Planning Instruction and Designing Learning Experiences for Students
- Creating and Maintaining Effective Environments for Student Learning
- Developing as a Professional Educator

<u>Required Hours</u>: LIBS 4910 requires varying amounts of time depending upon the number of units earned. Students average 6 to 8 hours per week for the semester with a total of 10-12 hours per week with a total of **145 hours for 3 units** of credit; and/or 12-16 hours per week for a semester with a total of **192 hours for 4 units** of credit.

The Learning Agreement:

Students will submit 2 copies of the attached Learning Agreement by email, fax, or hard copy no later than the third week (September 11, 2013). One copy will be returned to you. It is the student's responsibility to retrieve a copy from the LIBS Department in DBH-300. Your activity must include the specific number of required hours outlined above. Please provide a detailed day and time grid sheet or time sheet when submitting your hours. Grades are assigned after submission of the final written report and written verification of total hours by your supervisor. This verification must be on site letterhead or on the on-site supervisor's letterhead with a signature from the supervisor.

The Final Written Report

The final paper for this project is **due at noon on Wednesday December 4, 2013,** must include **all** of the following:

- A description of the activities completed for the project;
- Discussion and assessment of learning objectives, including a Teaching Performance Expectation;
- Identification of personal strengths and/or weaknesses discovered in completion of this project;
- Materials developed as part of the activity, if applicable;
- Paper is properly APA formatted (cover page, double space, margins, title, etc.)
- A signed statement from the on-site supervisor on site letterhead confirming that the activity was completed as agreed, with verification of total hours devoted to the activity.
- A detailed day and time grid sheet, schedule or time sheet to verify your hours
- All materials should be stapled together with the grading sheet (see below) when submitted for grading.

<u>Grading</u>: Grading Option 2: Grades are assigned upon successful completion of the final written report and signed verification of hours from the on-site supervisor of the project who signed the course Learning Agreement. See attached grading sheet on the next page.
