## The Master of Science in Nursing degree with a Family Nurse Practitioner Concentration requires completion of 48 units distributed as follows:

- 1. 26 units of core courses (includes 2 units Culminating Experience and 1 unit of Culminating Experience Preparation),
- 2. 22 units of graduate coursework in a concentration or specialization,
- Students completing the comprehensive examination must participate in an oral presentation to complete the program.
- 4. 675 hours of supervised intensive experience (CCNE and BRN require 500)

## **Progression**

- 1. Students in the graduate nursing program must maintain a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 in courses taken to satisfy the requirements of the degree.
- 2. A grade of 82 or higher is required to pass a course.
- 3. Successful completion of all courses is required to progress in the program.

Note: Some courses may be taught in a hybrid format.
