There will likely be variations; if you can't take a course in the semester recommended above, plan to pick up the class in a future semester.

In general, you are not required to take Honors classes that meet the same GE requirements as classes that are pre-requisites to or required by your major. Please be careful not to take courses that fulfill the same GE requirements as your Honors classes if they aren't required for your major (see the Honors GE Advising Worksheet to plan you non-Honors GE classes).

Please note that you must have completed 60 units (including GE Area A and Area B4 classes) to enroll in GE Area UD-B, C, D courses for them to fulfill the upper division GE requirement (i.e. don't take HONS 3000, 3100, or 3050 before your junior year/earning 60 units).

Some Honors courses require permission numbers but you'll be able to enroll in most classes on your own. You'll receive an email with information about registration and instructions for requesting any permission numbers you'll need before priority registration starts near the end of each semester.

Transfer students are welcome in all of the lower division courses, but will usually complete only the Third and Fourth year classes.

Be sure to take HONS 3990 in your second-to-last (penultimate) spring semester so you can complete the full Honors Capstone project sequence.
