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Transitioning to Credential Program

- **Multiple Subject Credential Program is graduate school.** You must apply to the program; being a LIBS major does not give you automatic acceptance.
- Elementary Subject Matter/CSET – LIBS students with overall GPA of 2.67 or 2.75 in last 60 units and all Subject Matter classes meet the requirement.
- See Teacher Education website for entrance requirements.

Bilingual Authorization

- Bilingual Authorization added to your Multiple Subjects Credential.
- Preparation to teach in the target language in a bilingual or dual language classroom.
- Take foundations courses within LIBS major (LIBS 4400 instead of LIBS/ENGL 4800).
- See Dr. Soodjinda (LIBS faculty) for course options and concentration information.

ITCO

Integrated Teaching Credential Option

- Liberal Studies BA degree and a Multiple Subject and/or Education Specialist Credential **in four years.**
- Concentration: Exceptional Children and Youth.
- Must apply – see LIBS website for application and process.
- LIBS 1000 & MATH 1030 in 1st semester for freshmen. LIBS 3200 in 1st semester for transfers. Transfer students must take 6-7 courses a semester, and be completely done with lower-division GE before transferring.

Introductory Authorizations

- Teach 9th grade and below with Multiple Subject Credential.
- Teach Social Science, English, Math, or Natural Science.
- Must have 32 units in area, AND meet all requirements.
