### Transitioning to Credential Program

- Multiple Subject Credential Program is graduate school. You must apply to the program; being a LIBS major does not give you automatic acceptance.
- Elementary Subject Matter/CSET LIBS students with overall GPA of 2.67 or 2.75 in last 60 units and all Subject Matter classes meet the requirement.
- See Teacher Education website for entrance requirements.

### Bilingual Authorization

- Bilingual Authorization added to your Multiple Subjects Credential.
- Preparation to teach in the target language in a bilingual or dual language classroom.
- Take foundations courses within LIBS major (LIBS 4400 instead of LIBS/ENGL 4800).
