

## **ENGLISH MAJOR REQUIREMENTS GUIDELINES**

**[Future HS English teachers use the SSMP Guidelines form, not this form.]**

### **LOWER-DIVISION STUDENTS:**

- Complete First-Year Writing Requirements
- Complete the Prerequisites to the Major before the end of your second year and before you enroll in upper-division major courses:  
  
ENGL 2100: British Lit to 1800 **OR** ENGL 2110: British Lit after 1800  
  
ENGL 2200 American Lit to 1865 **OR** ENGL 2210: American Lit after 1865  
  
(One of these classes must be the early period—2100 or 2200)
- Enroll in ENGL 3150: Approaches to Literary Study as early in your junior year as possible.
- ENGL 1010: Introduction to Literature is recommended for your GE area C.2 course, though it is not required for the English major.

### **TRANSFER STUDENTS: consult with the department chair regarding transfer credit for upper-division courses in the major.**

- If you did not complete the Prerequisites to the Major at your former institution, complete them in your first year in the program:  
  
ENGL 2100: British Lit to 1800 **OR** ENGL 2110: British Lit after 1800  
  
ENGL 2200 American Lit to 1865 **OR** ENGL 2210: American Lit after 1865  
  
(One of these classes must be the early period—2100 or 2200)
- Enroll in ENGL 3150: Approaches to Literary Study as soon as possible.

### **ALL UPPER-DIVISION STUDENTS:**

- ENGL 3150: Approaches to Literary Study prepares students for upper-division literary research and writing. It is a prerequisite for Shakespeare, Senior Seminar, all of the upper-division British Lit courses, and most of the upper-division World Lit and American Lit courses. 3150 should be taken as early in your junior year as possible. The minimum passing score for ENGL 3150 is a C-.
- ENGL 4990: Senior Seminar is our capstone course for the major. It should be taken in your final semester.
- Remember that you need **120 units** to graduate.
