Conference Information

The Dr. Marvalene Hughes Leadership Conference is a two-day conference that will be held Friday, March 3, from 11:30 a.m. – 5:30 p.m., and Saturday, March 4, from 7:30 a.m. – 5:30 p.m. This conference is a comprehensive experience focusing on building individual student leadership skills and fostering student engagement interactions. Our goal is to provide students with an opportunity to learn and discuss the leadership development tools needed to meet the personal and societal challenges they will encounter as students and professionals.

The objective of this conference is to inculcate students with the skills and mindset needed to empower themselves as change agents who demonstrate responsible leadership in their careers and communities. The Conference will include energetic speakers, lunch, and breakout sessions covering topics such as student organizations, public speaking, career development, leadership development, community engagement, and more. The Conference will help students discover their leadership potential and gain the knowledge to cultivate their leadership style.

Students who attend the Conference will earn the Dr. Marvalene Hughes Student Leadership Conference certificate, which commemorates their commitment to inspire and change the world while doing service for others in their communities. Students can add the Conference to their co-curricular transcripts highlighting their participation in the Conference and dedication to becoming change agents.

The challenge course is a series of individual and group challenges that require a combination of teamwork skills and individual commitment. The course ranges from ground level games and initiatives to high-level elements constructed of utility poles, ropes, and cables. The adventure program provides adventure learning experiences, which challenge individuals to push beyond their perceived limits, to work effectively with others, to think creatively about problems, to trust, and to have fun.
- **Community Service**
This community service experience will provide an opportunity for students to give back to the Stockton community. Attendees will be doing a variety of projects to beautify and improve facilities.
