

25LIVE EVENT TYPES

Banquet / Social

A formal or informal event, typically involving food and beverage service for the purpose of gathering many people for an activity or celebration.

Examples: Luncheon, Dinner, Pinning, Picnic, Party, Networking, Reception, Banquet

Exhibit / Info Table

Single or multiple displays intended to provide information to guests or to exhibit art and other items of interest.

Examples: Info Fair, Exposition, Art Show, Table Display, Booth/Vendor

Performance / Show

A theatrical, musical, or other display of talent or progress in the performing arts often in the form of staged entertainment.

Examples: Recital, Rehearsal, Audition, Concert, Play, Movie/Film screening

Camp / Clinic

A course or training for youth on a particular subject (such as music, sports, science) often with hands-on activities. Sometimes requires accommodations and may last days to weeks.

Festival

A large celebration usually involving organized interactive activities or events that attendees can participate in, as well as food. Often open to the public.

Examples: Carnival, Street Fair

Sporting Event

An athletic event or physical activity organized by a University Department.

Examples: Volleyball game, Tennis match

Campus Visit

An event in which a group of people come to see the university campus. May involve minors.

Examples: Tour, Tasting

Meeting

A discussion between two or more persons. Typically lasts no more than a few hours. Does not involve a formal presentation or panel discussion, and does not involve food except for the occasional light beverage/snack.

Student Activity

ANY event primarily organized, hosted, or run by a student organization. Access given to trained Student Event Coordinators only.

Available to: Student Org Requestors, SLD

Conference

A formal meeting that typically takes place over a number of days and involves people with a shared interest. Typically involves a large number of attendees, concurrent breakout sessions, and multiple locations. Registration is often open to the public.

Orientation / Ceremony

A formal celebratory or informational gathering usually held in commemoration or honor of an event/individual or to welcome newcomers to the university, its departments, or its programs.

Examples: Initiation, Pinning, Commencement

Workshop

Intensive group discussion or activity on a particular subject or project, often with the aim to teach or train individuals. May include panel presentations, discussions, etc. and are single sessions not happening concurrently.

Examples: Training, Forum, Tutoring, Study session, Guest speaker, Presentation, Lecture/Seminar, Certification, Testing
