General Requirements

You have completed a bachelor's degree (BA or BS)
OR

You are close to completing your degree (generally, in the last semester of the BA/BS program).

➢ GPA Requirement – The required GPA is 2.75 in the last 60 units or 2.67 overall. Refer to the <u>FAQs</u> for Special Admission information if you don't meet the GPA requirement.

Early Field Experience

45 hours of documented field experience are required prior to being admitted to the program, **must** be in K-6 grade US classrooms within the last 5 years. Substitute teaching, paraprofessional experience, or observing in a classroom are some options. (Not required for Stan State Libs Majors)

> English Composition

All CSU graduates will have met this requirement as part of their BA/BS degree.

Can be met by **ONE** of three options:

- Completion of a CSU WP class as part of the undergraduate program (verified by transcripts).
- Obtain 41 or better on the writing portion of the CBEST.
- c) Completion of an upper division composition course with a grade of 'C' or better.

American Government/Constitution

All CSU graduates will have met this requirement as part of their BA/BS degree. Can be met by **ONE** of two options:

- a) Completion of a college level course that covers the U.S. Constitution.
- b) Passing the <u>US Constitution Exam</u>

> Second Language Experience

Can be met by **ONE** of several options:


- a) Completion of a language other than English including American Sign Language at the college level with a passing grade (3 units).
- b) Completion of one year of a language other than English at the high school level with a passing grade. If using this option official HS transcript must be submitted w/application.
- c) Completion of HILT (High Intensity Language Training) Program.
- d) EDUC 4460 meets this requirement for <u>Spanish</u> <u>Bilingual students.</u>
- e) Other life experiences that demonstrate second language acquisition. See program handbook.

Valid certificate or permit issued by CCTC

- a) Certificate of Clearance, 30-day Sub Permit, or any other valid CCTC document are accepted.
- b) If you do not currently have a CCTC document, follow our <u>instructions for applying for your</u> Certificate of Clearance.
- c) Must remain current for entirety of credential program enrollment.

TB Clearance or TB Risk Assessment

Questionnaire – Good for 4 years. Must remain current for entirety of credential program enrollment.

All credential students interested in completing their clinical practice placement as a Student Teacher OR Intern are required to submit a ST-Fieldwork Application and be cleared by Field Services to proceed (even if employed). Frequently Asked Questions

How long does it take to complete the program?

The Concurrent option is 57-65 UNITS. Full-time students can complete this option in two years. See Teacher Education Handbook (Additional Information section below) for list of classes on page 50.

How much does it cost?

Full-time students pay about \$4,232 for 7 units or more each semester (Fall/Spring) and Part-time students pay about \$2,834 for 0-6 units per semester (Fall/Spring). Overall book costs are approximately \$700. Financial Aid is available for those who qualify but will only cover ONE program. Contact Financial Aid office for more details at (209) 667-3336.

What is required for Special Admission?

The Department of Teacher Education is allowed to admit a small number of students who do not meet admittance requirements. Students who are below the GPA requirements and have a minimum 2.5 GPA in the last 60 units if they have met all admission requirements, must submit a letter requesting special consideration for admittance. Special admission will only be granted if there is room available.
