

ROBERT NOYCE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

2024 - 2025 SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Robert Noyce Scholarship Program will award annual scholarships in the amount of **\$13,000** in exchange for teaching service upon completion of a credential. Science, Mathematics, and Computer Science majors who will attain Junior level status by Fall 2024 and STEM career professionals who have been admitted into the Single Subject Credential Program for Fall 2024 are eligible to apply.

A minimum 2.75 GPA is required.

Junior level scholarship recipients who maintain eligibility and fulfill program requirements will be eligible to receive a \$13,000 scholarship annually for a maximum of three years (\$13,000 Junior year + \$13,000 Senior year + \$13,000 Credential year) in exchange for a two-year teaching service commitment for each \$13,000 award received (\$39,000 total in exchange for a six-year teaching service agreement in a high need school).

We encourage applicants from underrepresented categories to apply.
