

Grades and Grade Points

Students are graded A-F or CR/NC as stated below:

Faculty members will state in their course syllabus if they use plus/minus grading.

The grading options which have been assigned to individual courses by departments and noted in class schedules are: (1) courses graded exclusively Credit/No Credit; (2) courses graded A-F--with the student's option to receive a Credit or No Credit grade; (3) courses graded A-F exclusively; (4) courses graded Credit/No Credit--with the student's option to receive a letter grade. To qualify for a baccalaureate degree, a student must maintain an average at least equal to a "C" (2.0) on the four-point system in all his/her graded courses. Probation and disqualification are based on failure to maintain a 2.0 grade point average.
