

Summer 2011 Financial Aid Fact Sheet

Is Summer Aid Available?

Yes. Limited financial aid is available for the summer term to students who qualify. Summer financial aid may consist of [Federal Pell Grant](#) and [Federal Direct Loans](#). Students that do not have eligibility for the Pell grant or Federal Direct loans may be eligible for a campus grant.

What Are the Requirements?

- To be considered for summer aid, you must be a continuing CSU Stanislaus student AND have a [2010 – 2011 Free Application for Federal Student Aid \(FAFSA\)](#) on file with the Financial Aid and Scholarship Office by **May 27, 2011**. If you already completed a 2010 – 2011 FAFSA, you do NOT need to submit another one for summer aid.
- Summer 2011 is considered the last term for the 2010 – 2011 academic year. Summer financial aid availability depends on whether you have already used your full eligibility amount of [Federal Pell Grant](#) and [Federal Direct Loans](#) during the Fall 2010 and/or Spring 2011 terms. Under limited conditions, Federal Pell Grant eligible students who enroll half-time and who have already received their full 2010 – 2011 Federal Pell Grant eligibility during the Fall and Spring terms, may be eligible to receive an additional Pell Grant award during the Summer 2011 term. Your file will be evaluated for the additional Federal Pell Grant eligibility at the time of summer awarding. Graduate students do not qualify for the Federal Pell Grant.
- Registering at the same time for all summer term classes in one or more sessions will facilitate the processing of your financial aid request. Your summer aid eligibility is based on your total units of enrollment in all summer sessions.
- The Financial Aid and Scholarship Office will begin awarding summer financial aid in late April. All students will be notified of their eligibility via their CSUS e-mail account and their mycsustan account. **You must be enrolled to be considered for summer aid. Please note that it may take up to 3 weeks to be awarded summer aid once you establish half-time summer enrollment.**
- Students that have graduated Spring 2011 and are attending Summer 2011 to complete pre-requisites for **ANY** program, are not eligible for financial aid during the Summer 2011 term.

How Does It Work?

- Once you have registered for summer classes, you will need to submit your request for summer aid using the Summer Application form located on the Financial Aid and Scholarship Office website – www.csustan.edu/financialaid. You will be awarded any Pell Grant eligibility you have left. To be considered for a summer loan, you must submit a [Summer Loan Request Form](#) by **June 17, 2011 and be enrolled at least half time**.
- Summer financial aid **will begin disbursing the week of June 6th** to those who qualify and weekly thereafter.
- Your summer financial aid award may not cover campus fees. Any balance due to the University must be paid immediately. Fees, housing obligations and other costs (except parking) are deducted from your financial aid refund.

How Much Am I Eligible to Receive?

The amount and type of summer aid you will be eligible for will depend on many factors, including grade level, need, and whether you have exhausted your eligibility for federal grants and loans during the regular 2010 – 2011 academic year. If you are unsure about your exact circumstance, you can always check with the Financial Aid and Scholarship Office. Although we will be unable to process your summer aid on a walk-in basis, you may see an advisor, during regular walk-in hours, to obtain an estimate of your summer aid eligibility.

Withdrawal and Financial Aid

Important! Before withdrawing, [contact the Financial Aid and Scholarship Office](#). If you completely **withdraw** from the University (including medical withdrawal) before the 60% of your enrollment period, you may have to repay all or part of the award you received.
