



## Faculty Employment Opportunity

**POSITION:** **Assistant Professor of Philosophy:** The Department of Philosophy invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor. The person appointed to this position will teach in the areas of: *History of Philosophy and Continental Philosophy*. Additional courses supporting the General Education curriculum will be assigned on the basis of the candidate's areas of competence. Evidence of effective teaching, scholarly productivity, and service to the University are required for retention, promotion, and tenure. This position is contingent on the availability of authorized funding. Additional interdisciplinary teaching opportunities may be available within the Honors, Gender Studies, and Latin American Studies programs.

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:** A Ph.D. in Philosophy is required (with formal training in Continental Philosophy). Teaching experience relevant to the position.

**PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:** A candidate's consideration will be enhanced by evidence of: outstanding teaching in the history of philosophy and Continental philosophy; publications in refereed journals and academic presses; clear and compelling understanding of major figures within the Continental tradition; and commitment to and understanding of the history of philosophy for contemporary philosophical research.

**HOW TO APPLY & DEADLINE:** A complete application must include: an application letter specifically addressing the position description and qualifications; a current CV; teaching and research portfolios (with teaching evaluations, sample syllabi and writing sample strongly encouraged); graduate transcripts; and three letters of reference with contact information. Official transcripts will be required at the time of hire. Screening of completed application files will begin on December 15th and continue until the position is filled, with phone and on-campus interviews likely in January and February. This appointment begins on August 18, 2017. Letters of reference may be sent through Interfolio.

### **CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CLEARANCE NOTICE**

The university requires a criminal background check to be completed for all of its new employees, current employees seeking promotional or transfer opportunities, and current employees assigned new duties.
