- POSITION:** **Lecturer in Philosophy:** The Philosophy program invites applications for a part-time Lecturer in Philosophy. The department has needs in ethics and the history of philosophy for a candidate with substantial training in the continental tradition. Fall 2015 teaching responsibilities will include up to four courses, packaged together from the following: PHIL 2700/Political Philosophy; PHIL 3000/Philosophical Reading and Analysis; PHIL 3050/Existentialism; PHIL 4430/Bioethics. The Spring 2016 assignment may include up to five courses (predominantly upper-division), including PHIL 3400/Ethics and PHIL 4430/Bioethics.
- MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:** Ph.D. preferred; ABD considered (MA in Philosophy required, plus completion of all Ph.D. coursework).
- PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:** A candidate's consideration will be enhanced by evidence of effective teaching at the university level and a Ph.D. in Philosophy.
- HOW TO APPLY & DEADLINE:** A complete application is required and must include: an application letter addressing the position description and qualifications; photocopies of graduate transcripts; curriculum vita, including the names and contact information for three references; and evidence of successful teaching, including recent teaching evaluations. Official transcripts will be required at the time of hire. This appointment begins August 19, 2015 and continues through June 1, 2016. Reappointment is contingent on a favorable review and available classes.
