POSITION:	Full-time Lecturer, Psychology: The Department of Psychology and Child Development invites applications for a full-time lecturer, non-tenure-track appointment in Psychology for Spring 2018. This position requires a background in research methodology and statistics and an open area of specialization. The candidate should have experience in teaching these courses and a track record of good teaching evaluations. This position requires a commitment to teaching at the undergraduate level. We seek to hire an individual to enhance the programs on the Stockton campus (and will do most of their teaching on the Stockton campus), and someone who is committed to teaching excellence, as well as performing advising and supervision as needed. Position is contingent on available funding.
MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:	M.A., M.S., or Ph.D. or ABD in Psychology (Ph.D. preferred) or related field with a background in research methods and statistics. Candidates with teaching and research experience with diverse populations and the ability to work with diverse student populations in a multicultural setting are preferred.
HOW TO APPLY & DEADLINE:	A complete application must include: a letter of application, photocopies of a complete set of unofficial graduate transcripts, a curriculum vita, evidence of teaching effectiveness, telephone numbers for three references; three current letters of recommendation preferred. Official transcripts will be required at the time of hire. The position will remain open until filled. Review of applications will begin immediately. The appointment will begin Spring 2018 or when filled.

CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CLEARANCE NOTICE

The university requires a criminal background check to be completed for all of its new employees, current employees seeking promotional or transfer opportunities, and current employees assigned new duties. Necessary background investigations will be conducted, as required, depending upon the job requirements of position. These could include, but are not limited to, employment verification, education verification, reference checks, and criminal records checks via processing of fingerprints through the Department of Justice and FBI, as well as, license verification upon employment. Additionally, all applicants or employees whose responsibilities include regular or direct contact with minor children are subject to the child abuse background check.
