POSITION:

ASSOCIATE OR ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF PSYCHOLOGY: The Department of Psychology and Child Development invites applications for a full-time, tenured or tenure-track appointment (at the rank of Associate or Assistant Professor depending on experience) Primary teaching responsibilities will be in Applied Behavior Analysis. A BCBA is preferred with varied experience in ABA (including supervisory experience). This faculty member will teach in our unique BCBA/MFT MS program, so preference will be given to Behavior Analysts with clinical experience. Other responsibilities may include advising students, supervising graduate research, and facilitating assessment of student learning. Effective teaching is essential for retention, promotion, and tenure; scholarly productivity and service to the department and to the University or broader community are also expected. This position is contingent upon the availability of authorized funding. This is an academic year appointment, but opportunities exist for additional Summer Session teaching.

**MINIMUM
QUALIFICATIONS:**

A PhD in Psychology is required; ABD in Psychology is required at the time of application. Ph.D. required at the time of Appointment (August 18, 2014). The successful applicant will also have experience teaching at the undergraduate and at the graduate level.

**PREFERRED
QUALIFICATIONS:**

We seek applicants who will enhance our existing programs and help expand our growing department into new areas. Successful applicants will be talented, energetic individuals whose passions are teaching and mentoring students. A potential candidate's consideration will be enhanced by demonstrating teaching effectiveness (through student evaluations, direct assessment measures of student learning, or other means), and by demonstrating a potential for outstanding scholarly activity. Candidates with prior experience teaching will be viewed more favorably than candidates lacking this experience.

**HOW TO APPLY
& DEADLINE:**

A complete application must include: a cover letter that specifically addresses the position description and qualifications; unofficial photocopies of graduate transcripts; and a curriculum vitae, including the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of three references. Letters of reference are not initially required; official transcripts will be required at the time of hire. Candidates should also forward representative teaching materials (e.g., syllabi and sample course materials), evidence of teaching effectiveness, and (pre)prints. Screening of completed application files will begin immediately. The position will remain open until filled. This appointment begins on August 2014.
