

BA in Gender Studies Four Year Road Map

First and Second Years

The Gender Studies program does not have any required lower division units. Students are expected to complete the Lower Division General Education (GE) requirements within the first 60 units. Students may apply up to six units of lower division (LD) coursework to the requirements for the major. Lower division courses currently include:

- GEND/SOCL 2010 – Sociology of Sexual Behavior (does not count toward GE)
- GEND 2020 – Women’s and Feminist Activism (GE Area D2b, and satisfies the Historical Perspectives requirement in the major)
- GEND 2500 – Women’s Development and Lifestyle Choices (GE Area E1)

Although this sample road map places all 3000 and 4000-level courses in the third and fourth year, advanced lower-division students may enroll in upper-division courses if prerequisites are met. In consultation with an advisor, students may choose to take Core and Concentration courses in a different order than those indicated in the road map, but should note that GEND 3000 and GEND 4200 are currently offered every other year, and that GEND 4930 should be taken at least once during the senior year (the course may be repeated if a different topic is offered).

4. Concentration (12 units)

Select courses from one of three concentrations. Courses used to satisfy required courses in the major (see above) may be applied to the concentration requirements, although the credit hours will not double-count. See attached worksheet.

- a. History, Society, and Inequality (Choose any 12 units)**
- b. Culture, Ideology, and Representation (choose any 12 units)**
- c. Ethnicity, Nationality, and Sexuality (choose any 12 units)**

5. Gender Studies Electives (0-12 units)

Upon approval from an adviser, elective units are to be selected from among courses listed under or cross-listed with Gender Studies to complete 30 total units for the major. The number of elective units depends upon the selection of courses used to satisfy major and concentration requirements. Courses addressing issues of sex, gender or sexuality that are not currently cross-listed with Gender Studies may be approved for inclusion in the Major with advisor's or director's approval.
