

## NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION QUICK REFERENCE GLOSSARY

TERM	DEFINITION	RESOURCES
<b>Asynchronous Online Class</b>	Class instruction is available to students 24/7 via the web. No in-person meetings scheduled.	<a href="#">Online Readiness Self-Assessment</a>
<b>Synchronous Online Class</b>	Class instruction is delivered on pre-scheduled days and times via the web or remote broadcast. No in-person meetings scheduled.	<a href="#">Online Readiness Self-Assessment</a>
<b>Hybrid Class</b>	Class instruction includes both in-person and online components, with pre-scheduled in-person meetings. The online component can be either asynchronous or synchronous.	<a href="#">Online Readiness Self-Assessment</a>
<b>Advisors</b>	Stan State Faculty and Staff that help students make decisions regarding their classes and academic goals.	<a href="#">Advising Hub</a>
<b>Catalog Year</b>	In reference to an academic year that determines graduation requirements. New students' catalog year is the same matches their admission term (e.g. a fall 2020 new student's catalog year is 2020-21).	<a href="#">Full Catalog Year description</a>
<b>Co-Requisite</b>	Two or more specific classes that must be taken during the same semester.	
<b>Course Number</b>	A 5-digit reference number used to identify specific sections of a class. Course Numbers can be used during registration to reference sections quickly, making the registration process faster and easier.	
<b>Drop</b>	In reference to "dropping a class": disenrolling from a class section and stopping participation. This can be done from your student portal during established time periods.	<a href="#">Registration dates and deadlines for each semester are posted on the Class Schedule</a>
<b>Enrollment</b>	Registration into one or more class sections.	
<b>FERPA</b>	The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law protecting the rights and privacy of students.	<a href="#">View information on Student Rights and FERPA</a>
<b>General Education (GE)</b>	A series of courses required for a Bachelor's degree. Not all students will take the same GE courses.	<a href="#">General Education Information</a>
<b>Hold</b>	A restricted status placed on a student's account that may prohibit the student from certain actions such as registration into classes, receiving transcripts, etc.	
<b>Late Add</b>	Registration into a class after the first week of the semester.	<a href="#">Registration dates and deadlines for each semester are posted on the Class Schedule</a>
<b>Matriculation</b>	A word for when a student is enrolled or registered at a university.	
<b>Pre-Requisite</b>	A class that must be completed before registering for a different class (i.e. the pre-requisite class fulfills a requirement for registration in another class).	

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<b>Waitlist</b>	A roster, or list, of students interested in registering for a class section that has already met maximum capacity.	
<b>Warrior Username</b>	The beginning of your university email address, up to the @ sign (e.g. the warrior username for jdoe1@csustan.edu is "jdoe1").	
<b>Warrior ID</b>	A unique 9-digit number used to identify a student; The ID number starts with leading zeroes and is printed on your Warrior ID Card and in the Student Center.	<a href="#">Warrior ID</a>
<b>Term</b>	A specific academic year and semester (e.g. Fall 2008 or Summer 2019).	
<b>Census Date</b>	The twentieth day of instruction for Fall and Spring semesters--this is the last date that any registration requests can be made for that term (i.e. adding or dropping a class) Census dates for Special Session Winter and Summer are determined by Extended Education.	<a href="#">Academic Calendar</a>
<b>Grading Options</b>	Students may be graded on a Credit/No Credit (CR/NC) basis or for a letter grade. Students may elect to change their grading option.	<a href="#">Information on Grading Procedures</a>
<b>Permission Number</b>	A unique number given to students to enable registration into a closed or restricted class through the Student Center.	<a href="#">Instructions for Adding a Class using a Permission Number</a>
<b>To Do List</b>	A list of items requiring action located in your Student Center	<a href="#">Instructions for viewing your To Do List</a>
