- I. **Call to Order.** Strahm called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m.
- II. **Approval of Agenda.** The agenda of January 27, 2022 was approved.
- III. **Approval of Minutes.** The minutes of December 2, 2021 were approved as distributed.
- IV. **Announcements/Reports**
  - A. The batch program modality change form in Curriculog has been launched. This is a new streamlined process. Programs please work with your college dean if you are interested in requesting a new program modality effective fall 2022 and after.
  - B. Ethnic Studies and Social Justice Concentration in Liberal Studies proposal was approved unanimously at Academic Senate.
  - C. Agricultural B.S. proposal was approved unanimously at Academic Senate.
  - D. Communication Studies B.A. proposal was approved unanimously at Academic Senate.
  - E. The [AA/07/AS/21/ATLC Web Conferencing Camera Policy](#) states that faculty cannot require students to turn on their camera: *“RESOLVED: That until such time as a campus-wide policy is developed and approved, faculty may not require students to have their cameras on during synchronous class sessions until such time as permanent policy is in place and that student choice of having their camera on or off will not directly impact student grades; and it be further”*.
- V. **New Business**
  - A. **Criminal Justice B.A.\* (Degree Completion).** Proposal was reviewed in curriculog- Criminal Justice is increasing total units. UEPC unanimously approved the proposal.
  - B. **Nursing B.S.: Accelerated Second Degree Option (ASBSN)\*.** Proposal was reviewed in curriculog- Nursing is requesting hybrid modality. Mary Jo Stanley joined the meeting and answered questions about the proposal. ASBSN is an accelerated program. Students are provided the option to focus on clinicals. There are some online components and some in person. This will remove the barrier for working students. UEPC unanimously approved the proposal.

- C. Nursing B.S.: Pre-licensure Track.** Proposal was reviewed in curriculog- Nursing is requesting hybrid modality. UEPC unanimously approved the proposal.
- D. WASC Report.** Wooley shared information on the WASC report. A working draft for the WSCUC Interim report was shared with committee. The interim report is smaller. It is limited in scope to focus on issues at Stockton campus. Input is needed from campus community. UEPC should mostly address issue one. Instead of a list of activities, the report should include assessment of activities. Assessment of student support services, academic supports such as tutoring and supplemental instruction, classroom technology services, co-curricular experiences, high-impact practices, and other supports for engaged learning; and faculty support. Faculty should send input to Speaker Dana Nakano by February 10, 2022. The report is due on March 1, 2022.
- E. General Education Area F Outcomes.** General Education Subcommittee is submitting the recommendation to UEPC that GE Area F be aligned with GE Outcome 2.3 as the anchor outcome and 3.3 and 3.4 as suggested outcomes. This was consulted with and approved by Ethnic Studies. Also, should GE Area F fall under General Education Subcommittee in curriculog?
- i. Outcome 2.3 - Recognize the structures and institutions that frame human interactions. Outcome 3.3 - Identify and analyze problems within local, regional, national, and/or global contexts. Outcome 3.4 - Demonstrate enhanced awareness of multicultural, community, and/or technological perspectives.
  - ii. UEPC will vote on the outcomes via email.
  - iii. UEPC has not received a response from Ethnic Studies to discuss the approval process moving forward. General Education Area F can be placed under General Education in curriculog for now.

- A. Program Modification Process.** "Adding an elective course to a required section does NOT constitute a program modification." Voting yes agrees with this statement and changes the way academic affairs handles program modifications of this nature. Voting no disagrees with this statement and retains the current program modification policy.
- i. Currently, removing an elective course from a required section also requires a program modification. UEPC is only voting on adding an elective course from a required section.
  - ii. UEPC voted: 10 yes, 0 no.
