Effectiveness of the Flipped Classroom Teaching Method:

How it Impacts Motivation, Performance, and Satisfaction in the Classroom

The flipped classroom is a teaching method that is rapidly gaining popularity amongst educators, but since it is a fairly new method, its effectiveness can be an area of controversy.
