Introduction:

The Stanislaus State Citizen Police Academy is a seven-week program designed to educate members of the campus community about law enforcement on our campus through various methods of instruction including lectures, activities, discussions and scenario training. In addition to learning about law enforcement and community service, students will have the opportunity to explore new career opportunities and develop relationships that will last well beyond the course.

Objectives:

- To promote the Stanislaus State Police Department as an agency that is dedicated to the students, staff and faculty of our campus, and to the community we live in.
- To educate the public about the necessity of a positive community/police relationship.
- To provide members of the public the opportunity to learn from officers who have knowledge in a variety of areas of law enforcement.
- To provide transparency and build trusting relationships with the members of our community.
- To have fun!

The Citizen Police Academy is not designed to be a substitute for accredited law enforcement training, provide legal advice or teach people how to circumvent the law.

Participant Requirements:

- 1) Participation in all activities and discussion.
- 2) Participants are allowed two absences each.
- 3) Each student has the **OPTION** to complete one ride-along with a University Police Officer or Community Service Officer. A ride-along will be arranged through the Citizen Police Academy Coordinator. Each participant must complete a waiver prior to participating in a ride-along.
- 4) Participants must adhere to campus rules and parking fees.

Week 1: February 27, 2019 @ UPD EOC, 6pm to 8pm

- **Introduction to the University Police:** Participants will become familiar with the University Police Department, including authority & jurisdiction, POST training requirements, patrol areas, and receive a tour of the facility and equipment employed by its officers. (*Instructor: Lieutenant Matt Dillon*)
- **Introduction to Dispatch:** Participants will learn about 911 call taking and how officers are dispatched in the field. (*Instructor: Dispatcher Misty Strobe*)

Week 2: March 6, 2019 @ UPD EOC, 6pm to 8pm

- **Basic Law Enforcement Principals:** Participants will receive an overview of the criminal justice system, and learn how it is applied on a day to day basis by officers. (*Instructor: Chief Clint Strobe*)
- **Introduction to Taser:** Students will receive an overview on the operation of Taser electronic control device and its proper use and deployment. (*Instructor: Sergeant Steve Olson*)

Week 3: March 13, 2019 @ UPD EOC, 6pm to 8pm

- **Theory and Operation of Traffic Radar:** Students will learn the basic principles behind the theory and operation of traffic radar. Discussion will include how radar equipment works, proper care and maintenance of the equipment, and proper field applications for enforcement. (*Instructor: Officer Phil Kozicki*)
- **Active Shooter:** Students will receive an overview of active shooter incidents to better understand what motivates individual shooters, and how they can maximize their safety during an active shooter event. Participants will also learn what to expect from law enforcement responding to an active shooter incident. (*Instructor: Officer Givo Ysael*)

Week 4: March 27, 2019 @ UPD EOC, 6pm to 8pm

- **DUI Investigation:** Students will learn about the effects of driving while under the influence of alcohol and narcotics. Students will learn about preliminary alcohol screening (PAS) devices, & participate in mock standardized field sobriety tests (SFST). (*Instructor: Chief Clint Strobe*)

Week 5: April 3, 2019 @ UPD EOC, 6pm to 8pm

- **Traffic Enforcement:** Students will learn about traffic stops and some of the considerations & dangers associated with them. Students will participate in mock traffic stops to experience traffic enforcement from an officer's perspective. (*Instructor: Sgt. Cheri Silveira, Officer Phil Kozicki, Officer Colton Risley, Officer Givo Ysael*)

Week 6: April 10, 2019 @ UPD EOC, 6pm to 8pm

- **Use of Force:** Students will learn about the Departments policy on use of force, and some of the associated legal considerations. Participants will participate in reviews of current use of force issues that have received media national coverage. (*Instructor: Sergeant Steve Olson*)
- **Evidence Collection:** Students will learn various considerations for field collection of evidence. Participants will engage in hands-on collection and packaging of different types of evidence. (*Instructor: Sergeant Steve Olson, Officer Colton Risley, Officer Givo Ysael*)

Week 7: April 17, 2019 @ Student Recreation Complex (SRC), 6pm to 8pm

- **Physical Agility:** Students will have the opportunity to participate in common physical agility tests used in the selection process for entry level law enforcement positions. Tests will include a weighted dummy drag, a 6 foot tall wall climb, obstacle course, and a 500 yard run. (*Instructor: Chief Clint Strobe*)
