
Comma Splice

- A comma splice occurs when two complete sentences are joined by a comma, and there is no conjunction present.
- **4** A complete sentence consists of a subject and a verb.

Run-on Sentence

- **4** Run-on sentence involves two complete sentences merged together without any punctuation.
- **<u>Example:</u>** You wore a lovely hat it was your only defense.

Ways to correct comma splice and run-on sentences	Example
1. Just add one of the FANBOYS coordinating conjunctions	The dog chased the cat, \underline{so} the cat climbed a tree.
For And Nor	You wore a lovely hat, <u>for</u> it was your only defense.
But Or Yet	
So 2. Change the comma to a semicolon	The dog chased the cat <u></u> ; the cat climbed a tree. You wore a lovely hat <u></u> ; it was your only defense.
3. Make each clause a separate sentence	The dog chased the cat. The cat climbed a tree. You wore a lovely hat. It was your only defense.
4. Add a subordinating conjunction although as/as if once even though so that while	The dog chased the cat <u>until</u> the cat climbed a tree.
